Overview

Kampuchea Action to Promote Education (KAPE), has consolidated some of its smaller and medium-sized projects into one umbrella program called Inclusive Education Program (IEP). Its main goal is to increase access to education, especially for girls, minorities and other vulnerable and marginalized children and youth. IEP assists them at multiple levels from secondary school through to tertiary, vocational, and professional training levels. With the Digital Workforce Development (DWD) project, IEP counts now four different projects also including Cambodia Tertiary Scholarship Program (CTSP), STEM4Women project and Girls' Education Initiative project (GEI).

About scholarship program

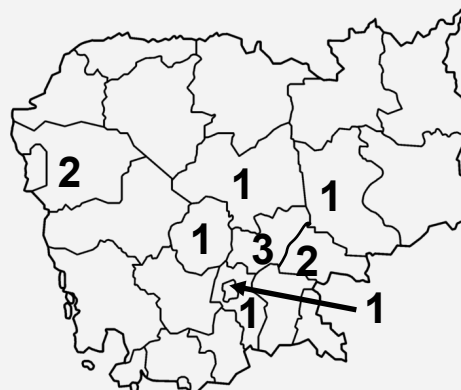
The USAID Scholarship program is part of the Digital Workforce Development (DWD) project, which is funded by the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) through the University of California at Berkeley (UCB).

The Asia Foundation (TAF), in close collaboration with KAPE, will manage, monitor, and implement the USAID scholarship program.

Target

12 poor young women from 8 different provinces graduated high school receive a four year scholarship support to study at Royal University of Phnom Penh major CSE and ITE.
